PUBLIC FORUM

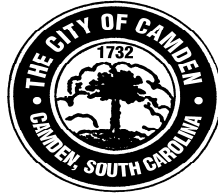
There were no public comments.

ORDINANCE #12-021 1st Reading

Council, on motion by Councilmember Long, seconded by Councilmember Partin, followed by discussion and comments from City Attorney Charles Cushman, voted unanimously to approve first reading of an Ordinance annexing various rights of way.

ORDINANCE #12-022 1st Reading

Council, on motion by Councilmember Polk, seconded by Councilmember Partin, followed by comments from City Manager Kevin Bronson and discussion from Council, voted



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unanimously to approve first reading of an Ordinance assigning final zoning classification to property belonging to Wateree Associates, LLC at 2209 West DeKalb Street. ORDINANCE #12-023 1st Reading

Council, on motion by Councilmember Long, seconded by Councilmember Partin, followed by comments from City Manager Kevin Bronson and discussion from Council, voted unanimously to approve first reading of an Ordinance adopting regulations for affordable housing.

RESOLUTION #12-017

Council, on motion by Councilmember Polk, seconded by Councilmember Partin, followed by comments from City Manager Kevin Bronson and discussion from Council, voted unanimously to approve a Resolution authorizing consumption of beer and wine at 24 Hours of LeMons Parade.

BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

During discussion of the Historic Landmarks Commission board vacancies, Councilmember Long recommended reappointing Mrs. Laurie Parks to the Historic Landmarks Commission. After further discussion, Council, on motion by Councilmember Polk, second by Councilmember Partin voted to unanimously accept the reappointment of Mrs. Laurie Parks to the Historic Landmarks Commission –Seat 4 with term set to expire on August 31, 2014. No recommendations were made for Seat 2 vacancy.
