ORDINANCE # 2016-017 2nd Reading

Council, on motion by Mayor Pro Tem Drakeford, seconded by Councilmember Graham, voted unanimously to approve second reading of an ordinance approving the financing of the sewer line rehabilitation and replacement of the City of Camden, South Carolina, through the borrowing of not exceeding seven million five hundred thousand dollars (\$7,500,000), plus capitalized interest, if any, from the State Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund, by agreement with the South Carolina Water Quality Revolving Fund Authority, pursuant to Title 48, Chapter 5, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended; providing for the agreement to make and to accept a loan, the execution and delivery of a loan agreement between the City of Camden, South Carolina and the South Carolina Water Quality Revolving Fund Authority, the execution and delivery of a



promissory note from the City of Camden, South Carolina to the South Carolina Water Quality Revolving Fund Authority; and other matters relating thereto.

ORDINANCE # 2016-018 2nd Reading

Council, on motion by Mayor Pro Tem Drakeford, seconded by Councilmember Graham, voted unanimously to approve second reading of an ordinance approving the financing of the rehabilitation and replacement of various water lines and water treatment plant improvements of the City of Camden, South Carolina, through the borrowing of not exceeding six million five hundred thousand dollars (\$6,500,000), plus capitalized interest, if any, from the state drinking water Revolving Loan Fund, by agreement with the South Carolina Water Quality Revolving Fund Authority, pursuant to Title 48, Chapter 5, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended; providing for the agreement to make and to accept a loan, the execution and delivery of a loan agreement between the City of Camden, South Carolina and the South Carolina Water Quality Revolving Fund Authority, the execution and delivery of a promissory note from the City of Camden, South Carolina to the South Carolina Water Quality Revolving Fund Authority; and other matters relating thereto.

ORDINANCE #2016-019 1st Reading

Council, on motion by Mayor Pro Tem Drakeford, seconded by Councilmember Graham, followed by comments from City Manager Mel Pearson and discussion from Council, voted unanimously to approve first reading of an ordinance approving an application for a special property tax assessment for a historic property; and other matters related thereto. (Property located at 1032 Broad Street).
